Response: Thank you Wayne,

We have spent years developing this technique and have been approved for our claims on the patent. We get excited to hear stories like yours all over the world. The few birds that keep coming back will in a few months stop. That's why we say, 96% Bird Control Guarantee. The majority of them leave, signaling the rest of them to leave, but scouts [birds] that are determined to stay keep coming back. If they stay (if you didn't have the Bird Buffer), the rest would return. As long as they feel it's there, they'll stay away.

When I raised homing pigeons and raced them, we would eventually be flying them 200 miles away and they would beat us home to their cage. One year after closing the cages, they were still coming back. They remember their home location from 200 miles away and will continue to try to test the area for moving back in. But eventually they will find it is easier to go somewhere else then try to stay there as long as you have the Bird Buffer.

Working with the Bird Buffer requires a little monitoring and change. Once you gain control of a high pressure area, you can continue to move back (into the wind) and gain a larger area. Eventually you will gain up to 3 or even 5 acres without a problem. When the wind switches, the birds in the other direction will leave for awhile. If you leave the machine in one location, you can reduce the amount of cycle time after 3 months, then again in 6 months to gain more control using less fluid. Eventually you will gain control over the outside area and up on the roofs and around the corners.

The buoyancy of these very tiny vapors does not settle when used properly. It's amazing how much area you can eventually cover. Being patient and not pushing it too fast is the key.

For Barnes and Noble, we had 3 very stubborn pigeons that we almost gave up on. But we moved the machine slightly to the west and 4 days later they were gone. So sometimes it's just being aware of the circumstances and adjusting accordingly.
